## **GRANTS AWARDED TO LOUISIANA NONPROFITS WORKING TO PROVIDE JUST AND EQUITABLE HOUSING**

***The Avon Foundation and the Foundation for the Mid South provide funds to  
organizations working to women with housing.***

**JACKSON, MS** (July 11, 2006) – The Avon Foundation in partnership with the Foundation for the Mid South has awarded \$485,000 in grants to nineteen nonprofit housing organizations in the Mid South to aid their recovery efforts. The grants—a total of six made to Louisiana organizations—provide funds to nonprofits that are addressing housing and shelter issues for displaced women or women who are heads of households and their families.

Grants up to \$50,000 were available through the Avon Foundation Housing Program Fund to support nonprofits' efforts in addressing an equitable recovery and restoration process. Funding for the grants from the Housing Program Fund was made possible by the Avon Foundation as part of their commitment to effectively respond to national and international disasters.

“The Foundation for the Mid South is committed to restoring housing in the hurricane-affected areas of the Mid South in a way that promotes equity for those who call the region home,” said Ivey Allen, president of the Foundation for the Mid South. “With dedicated partners like the Avon Foundation, we are working in new ways to respond to the disasters and to take an active role in rebuilding the Mid South better than it was before.”

The organizations selected to receive grants include: St. John #5 Baptist Church Camp ACE, New Orleans; Community Christian Concern, Inc., LaCombe; Urban League of Greater New Orleans, Inc., New Orleans; Family Resources of New Orleans, New Orleans; LSU, Office of Community Design and Development, Baton Rouge; and Neighborhood Housing Services of New Orleans, New Orleans.

“The Avon Foundation is proud to be a part of the critical recovery efforts in the wake of the devastating hurricanes,” stated Carol Kurzig, Executive Director, Avon Foundation. “There is still much work to be done and we are pleased to play a part.”
